\$60,000 IN GRANTS AWARDED TO LOCAL NONPROFITS IN SANTA CRUZ COUNTY

South32 today announced the names of seven charitable organizations selected to receive a total of \$60,000 in grants during the first selection cycle of the Hermosa Community Fund. The fund is held by the Community Foundation for Southern Arizona (CFSA) and was established by South32 in May of this year. It supports nonprofit groups working to improve education, environment, health and welfare, recreation, civic enhancement, and arts, culture and history in the county, in accordance with the community's needs and priorities.

Over 40 applications were received for this grant cycle, from which the following grantees were selected:

- Summer Lewton, who works in the Patagonia schools as assistant to the registrar and as secretary of the high school and elementary school; and
- Sabrina Hallman, the chair of the Santa Cruz Community Foundation and President/CEO of Sierra Seed.
